At the heart of space innovation, Sainte-Anne-de-Bellevue welcomed Prime Ministers Justin Trudeau and François Legault in September, who joined our mayor, Paola Hawa, to announce an innovative agreement with Telesat Canada.



The agreement is aimed at developing Lightspeed, one of the world's most advanced satellite networks. The expansion of the facilities and the creation of 500 new high-tech jobs will have a direct impact on the quality of life of local families and the vitality of the local economy. Thanks to its advantageous position on the island of Montreal, Sainte-Anne-de-Bellevue, already renowned for its natural beauty, rich heritage and dynamism, is a place where the future is built every day.

Square Bellevue: the future of housing for the 55+ age group

On October 3, in the presence of Mayor Paola Hawa, members of the municipal council and various stakeholders, the groundbreaking ceremony marked the beginning of a project that is redefining the way seniors live in Sainte-Anne-de-Bellevue.

Welcome to Square Bellevue: an innovative seniors' village, geared to those 55 and over, comprising over 825 modern residential units, strategically located close to transportation and Sainte-Anne's Hospital. The project embodies a new way of thinking about urban planning, integrating green spaces, landscaped parks and eco-conscious architecture, according to the "Age in Place" principles. A connected, vibrant and sustainable neighborhood where living has never been so inspiring!





Multifunctional path and bridge: facilitating active travel

Sainte-Anne-de-Bellevue, in collaboration with the Communauté métropolitaine de Montréal (CMM) and the Agglomération de Montréal, is taking its commitment to promoting active travel, accessible to all, a step further.
