The sale was finalized with Dév Méta in June 2023. Infrastructure work began the following November.

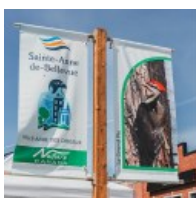
Phase 1 will begin in spring 2024 and last 24 months.

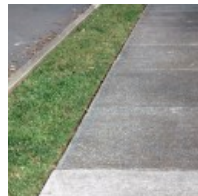

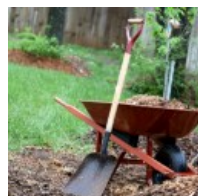

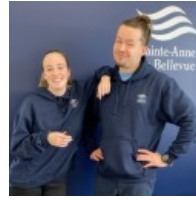
