PARKING

Overnight parking in winter

From December 1 to March 31, overnight parking on public roads is prohibited, unless otherwise specified. To find out if the ban is lifted for the night, consult the Info-Snow section of the website or call 514-457-1001, as of 4 p.m., daily.

The decision whether or not to lift the ban depends on weather conditions and on snow, ice or other operations planned by the Public Works Department.

It is the responsibility of all vehicle owners to consult daily updates before



parking their car on the street for the night. If the ban is not clearly lifted, the current regulation (no. 769) is applied and violators risk the fines provided for in the regulation.

Modification of the by-law concerning winter parking on streets located north of the Félix-Leclerc highway (40)

New this year - Amendment to Section 26 of By-law 769

Winter parking from 6 am to 1 am on streets north of the Félix-Leclerc Highway (40), between December 1st and March 31st of each year, will be structured as follows:

- a) On the even-numbered address side of the streets (always respecting the signage on site), parking will be permitted on Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays and Sundays and prohibited on the other days of the week;
- b) On the odd-numbered side of the street (always respecting the signage on site), parking will be permitted on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday and prohibited on other days of the week.

Parking on the commercial axis

The City of Sainte-Anne-De-Bellevue has allowed for an easing of the parking regulations on the commercial axis for the 2022-2023 winter season. From November 1st 2022 to April 30th 2023, it will be possible to park your car for more than 2 hours between 5pm and 4am.

The City Council wishes to encourage traffic in the city's businesses by allowing long-term parking in the evening in the commercial axis, especially during the holiday season.



In the event of snow, it is the duty of all citizens to verify whether or not on-street parking is permitted via the Info-Snow page.

Caution, keep the street curbs clear

In prevision of heavy snowfalls, make sure to place your garbage, recycling, organic bins and basketball hoop at a minimum distance of 3 feet (1 m) inside your property in order to facilitate the snow removal operations and to avoid that your bins be damaged by the snow removal trucks.

Also note that:

- · The lid must be closed.
- The bin must be in the driveway and not on the sidewalk or in the street.
- The handles and wheels of the bin must be facing the home

Rules concerning the use of solid fuel burning appliances and fireplaces

It is prohibited to use a solid fuel burning appliance or fireplace that is not **EPA or CAN/CSA- B415.1 certified** and that does not meet the **maximum particulate matter emission rate of 4.1 g/h**, except for homeowners with a grandfathered right until 2025.

It is also prohibited to use any solid fuel burning appliance or fireplace (whether it is compliant or not) when an Environment Canada smog warning is in effect for some or all of Sainte-Anne-de-Bellevue.
