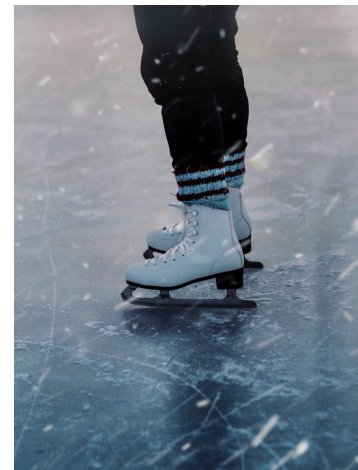

REMINDERS

On-street parking in winter

Until March 31, overnight parking on public roads is prohibited, unless otherwise indicated. To find out if the ban is lifted for the night, consult the [Info-Neige](#) section of the website or contact 514 457-1001, starting at 4:00 p.m., **daily**.

On-street parking during the Holiday Season

From **December 23 to January 8 inclusive**, the City will temporarily tolerate overnight parking on streets and in parking lots during the holiday season. This will allow your guests to park without restriction (**when parking is permitted**) beyond the time limits allowed to celebrate in peace and harmony.

Please note that this permission does not apply to Ste.-Anne Street.

Please be aware of the signs. If in doubt, contact the municipal patrol at 514 457-1001.

Conditions of use for fireplaces and other solid fuel burning appliances

No person shall operate a solid fuel burning appliance or fireplace that is not **EPA or CAN/CSA-B415.1** certified and that **does not meet an emission standard of 4.1 g/hr** or less of fine particulate matter to air, except for owners who are granted grandfathering until 2025.

It is also prohibited to use any solid fuel burning appliance or fireplace, whether compliant or not, when a **smog warning issued by Environment Canada is in effect** for a region that includes the City of Sainte-Anne-de-Bellevue, in whole or in part.
