A review of the demolition work at 82-84 Sainte-Anne Street

On May 23rd, the City of Sainte-Anne-de-Bellevue undertook the demolition project on the Marco Bar & Grill restaurant, located at 82-84 rue Sainte-Anne. Damaged by a major fire in April 2019, the building had since posed a threat to the



safety of citizens and altered the aesthetics of the street.

We wish to remind you that the City has acquired this space with the intention of converting it into a park. This initiative is intended to provide residents with better access to the water and to the Boardwalk. The purchase of the building and its conversion into a public space are part of the new City's Urban Plan, set to be released in 2024.

As of July 1st, 2023, residents of the Greater Montreal area who are **65 and older** can benefit from the *Free 65+ All modes A!* transit pass offered by the Société de transport de Montréal (STM).

This new pass will enable people aged 65 and over to **use public transit for free** throughout the Greater Montreal area (Zone A), by bus, metro, paratransit, Exo train or, when in service, with the REM.



STM agents will be on hand at Centre Harpell, 60 rue Saint-Pierre, on June 15 and 16, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., to help residents get their *Free 65+ All Modes A!* pass.
