
License and medal

<u>Cat</u>

CatThe owner of a cat, with the exception of a community cat, must obtain a mandatory cat license and cat tag (valid for the life of the cat) issued by the City.

When applying for a cat licence, the owner must provide his or her full name, address and telephone number. The owner must also provide the breed, sex, weight, color, year of birth and name of the cat.

The applicant must present valid photo identification and proof of residence.

<u>Dog</u>

The owner of a dog must obtain the required dog license from the City Administration.

A dog licence and tag will be issued to any person who submits a valid application and pays the required fee.

The dog licence is valid for the life of the dog and is non-assignable, non-refundable and non-transferable. The applicant must present valid photo identification with address and proof of residence.
