Repair work on the Chemin des Pins overpass

The Ministère des Transports has started repair work on the Chemin des Pins overpass over Highway 40 in Sainte-Anne-de-Bellevue on **August 8, 2022**. The overpass is closed to all traffic for the duration of the work.

Work on the boardwalk's lamp posts

Parks Canada wishes to inform the public that work will be undertaken as of **August 29, 2022** to repair the lamp posts along the Sainte-Anne-de-Bellevue Boardwalk, adjacent to the Sainte-Anne-de-Bellevue Canal National Historic Site. The work will take approximately **7 days over a period of 2 to 3 weeks** to replace the lamp posts wiring to render them functional and therefore ensure the safety of the site. Few impacts are expected and **visitors will be able to continue strolling along the boardwalk**.



Robillard Park development work

The City wishes to inform citizens that work on Robillard Park will begin on **September 6** and will last until the end of November. **Please note that during the work, access to the park will be prohibited**. Users of the dog park will have to use the bike path accessible from **Grenier Street**.

PARKING STICKERS

Reminders about stickers :

Extension of the bicycle path


The City of Sainte-Anne-de-Bellevue, in collaboration with the City of Montreal, has committed to obtaining a grant from the Montreal Metropolitan Community to build a footbridge over the wetland near Grenier Street.

The grant would help preserve the integrity and sustainability of the wetland. Additionally, this footbridge will make the bicycle path easily accessible as soon as the spring thaw begins.

Consequently, Sainte-Anne-de-Bellevue must confirm eligibility for the grant before starting work. Therefore, the project has been postponed until spring/summer 2023.

- All stickers are valid for the period from September 1st to August 31st and must be renewed each year.
- The sticker must be affixed to the windshield on the driver's side and be visible at all times.
- A sticker may not be assigned, sold or transferred to another person or vehicle.
- In case of a change of vehicle for which a sticker has been issued, a new sticker is issued upon presentation of proof of theft, destruction or change of vehicle.
- The vignettes are only valid in limited parking areas. Areas where no signage limits parking may be used by all road users.
- No sticker allows you to park your vehicle in parking spaces located in the commercial axis for more than two hours.
- No sticker allows you to park your vehicle for more than 48 consecutive hours in the same parking space.


