Our objective

In Sainte-Anne-de-Bellevue, only 43% of residual waste generated is recovered.

By 2025, our goal is to have 70% of residual materials recycled.

A collective effort!

To achieve this goal, the City is implementing household waste collection every two weeks and launching an awareness campaign to encourage its citizens to engage in thoughtful sorting!

Sainte-Anne-de-Bellevue is a community that values the environment and sustainability:

- Plastic bags are prohibited within the territory.
- We are a Bird-Friendly and Monarch-Friendly City.
- Urban beekeeping is allowed.
- The eco-friendly event Naturally Sainte-Anne is a success every year.
- The Moving Towards Sustainability Fund has been in place since 2013.

Weekly collection

Items accepted

Kitchen waste:

- Fruits and vegetables
- Egg shells
- Fish and seafood
- Meat and poultry, including bones
- Dairy products
- Bread, pasta and cereal products
- Nut shells

Garden waste:

• Plants, leaves, grass, thatch, mulch

- Compostable plastic bags certified by the Bureau de normalisation du Québec (BNQ)
- Unwaxed paper plates
- Paper towels
- Tissues
- · Pet food
- Condiments
- Soiled newspapers

Items not accepted:

- Plastic bags
- Dryer lint
- Wax paper
- Plastic packaging
- Styrofoam

Leaves and Green Waste

Leaves can be disposed of in paper bags, cardboard boxes or compostable plastic baas certified by the BNQ.

Bi-weekly collection

Items accepted

- Soiled litter
- Waxed paper (e.g.: ice cream container)
- Waxed packaging for meat or cheese
- Dental floss

- Animal waste

Sofa and mattresses

Citizens can place upholstered materials out for collection during household waste pickups.

Bulky Waste



The bulky waste collection takes place on the first Friday, every 2 months.
