



## Cruisin' at the Boardwalk: Street Closures

### *Closing of Rue Sainte-Anne, Saturday, June 15 from 5 am to 6 pm*

For the 11th consecutive year, our annual car show "Cruisin' at the Boardwalk" will be held on Rue Ste. Anne on Saturday, June 15. For this reason, Rue Sainte-Anne will be **closed to ALL vehicular traffic** between 5 am and 6 pm, between Maple and De l'Église.

In order to ensure the smooth running of the event, please respect the following instructions:

- Starting Friday, June 14, please park in the streets adjoining Sainte-Anne Street (vehicles parked on this street will be towed at their expense from 4 am the morning of June 15). Signs for this purpose will be installed from Thursday, June 13th.
- Parking lots adjacent to Sainte-Anne Street between Maple and De l'Église Streets will not be accessible. Du Collège Street parking will be open to residents and visitors.
- During the day of June 15th, you will not be able to reach your entrances, shops or other places in this area with your vehicle.
- Volunteers, signalmen, police officers and the Municipal Patrol will be on duty at 5:00 am to direct visitors to the John Abbott College and EXO train station parking lots.

We thank you for your usual collaboration, which is essential to the safety of all and the smooth running of this colorful family day.

# Spring Cleaning

We remind you that you are responsible for keeping your property in good condition and free of waste.

You must store your bins and bins so that they are not visible from the public road.

You can put your bin at the curb only between 7 pm the day before the collection and 7 am the day of. Place your bins back in your storage area as soon as possible, no later than 7 pm on the day of collection.

## COLLECTIONS SCHEDULE

### TUESDAY

#### Organic materials - brown bin

- Excess green residues can be deposited neatly in cardboard boxes or containers made of paper bags.
- NO plastic bag is accepted.

#### Household waste - bins with lid

- You MUST place your garbage bags into a rigid container with a lid. Bags that are not placed in a rigid bin will not be picked up.
- It is possible to take out your cumbersome/bulky garbage at every collection.

### WEDNESDAY

#### Recycling - blue bin

- Due to automated collection, only residues placed inside the blue bin will be picked up.
