REMINDER: PARKS AND PROMENADE DU CANAL CLOSED

We would like to remind citizens and visitors that **all the parks (including the National Historic Site of the Canal-de-Sainte-Anne-de-Bellevue) as well as the Promenade du canal are closed** until further notice. No one is allowed to walk on these sites. **Offenders are exposed to tickets.**

The SPVM, in collaboration with the municipal patrol, conduct surveillance tours on a regular basis and will intervene if necessary.

PRIORITY SERVICES AND STORES

The Quebec government has extended the shutdown period for non-priority services until May 4, 2020.

CURRENT STATUS UPDATE

Lac des Deux-Montagnes:

The current water level is above the threshold or minor flooding.

Lac St-Louis:

The current water level is above the threshold of minor flooding.

BE READY IN CASE OF FLOODS

In the event that floods occur again this year, the current situation with COVID-19 will make it difficult, if not impossible, to find volunteers and obtain other help and support services.

If you live in a flood risk zone, it is your responsibility to be prepared. It is IMPERATIVE that you take all the necessary measures to properly prepare yourself.

Be proactive!

- Check if your home is located in a [flood zone](#).
- Prepare your [family emergency plan and your emergency kit](#).
- [Register with CodeRED](#) in order to receive emergency notices issued by the City
- Check if your home insurance covers flooding.
- If you live by the river, stay alert to the weather forecast so you can react quickly if conditions deteriorate.

Get informed! Know what to do if the water goes up and prepare as much as possible.
