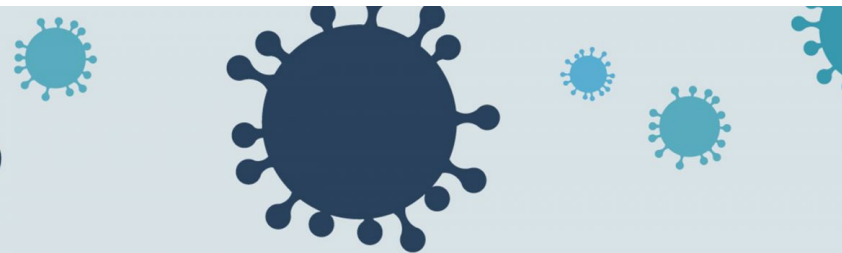

PERMITS FOR CONSTRUCTION WORK OR OTHER

If you need a permit for construction work, tree cutting or other, please contact 514-457-5500 or info@sadb.gc.ca to inform us of your need. An inspector will contact you within 48 hours to give you the steps to follow. This measure is in effect until further notice.

FLOODS EMERGENCY PLAN

We are currently working on the emergency plan and measures regarding the floods. As for the information session on this subject, we are analyzing the situation, given the current recommendations in connection with COVID-19. More information will follow soon.

DAY CAMP REGISTRATION

SERVICES FOR CITIZENS

UNIPRIX AND MARCHÉ RICHELIEU

The Uniprix pharmacy and the Marché Richelieu are still open according to their regular hours.

Uniprix encourages its customers to renew prescriptions online or by phone at 514-457-5681, in order to limit the waiting time in store. The delivery service is also available.

The Marché Richelieu has increased its delivery team and invites its customers to use this option for their purchases. Contact 514-457-5731.

PUBLIC TRANSIT
